From the Old Courthouse on the west to the renewed riverfront on the east, the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial grounds now extend in one continuous—and pedestrian friendly—urban greenspace. The Gateway Arch's sweeping new entryway is as impressive from the outside as the inside.* And the completely reimagined museum gives visitors all new ways to engage with local, national, and even their own personal history.*

IMPROVING ACCESSIBILITY

To extend the Gateway Arch experience to as many visitors as possible, we've implemented a number of changes to improve accessibility.

- Additional pathways throughout the park, including gently sloping walkways connecting the Gateway Arch to the riverfront
- Additional bus drop-off locations closer to the new Gateway Arch entrance
- ► 1.5 miles of new pedestrian pathways along the riverfront
- Open floor plan for easier navigation of the new visitor center and museum. Exhibits are wheelchair accessible with small-scale tactile models and audio descriptions available.*

The Gateway Arch

Often called the Gateway to the West, the Gateway Arch is a towering testament to America s pioneering spirit. Your guests can stroll the exterior in search of the perfect photo op. Then, take the tram ride to the top of the nation s tallest man made monument. As much art as it is engineering, the Gateway Arch will move them, in more ways than one.

During construction (through June 30, 2018), all visitors must have a paid, timed Tram Ride to the Top or Entry Only ticket to enter the Gateway Arch facility. Group discounts are available for the Tram Ride to the Top. Tickets must be purchased in advance.

- Box lunches available March through November with advance notice of a week or more.



Beginning July 1, 2018, Entry-Only tickets will not be required for admission to the Gateway Arch facility, and the documentary movie will require paid admission (group rates apply).
